
Another Turtle Sanctuary Protected!

Nova Scotia's Blanding's Turtles have more critical habitat safeguarded, thanks to the generosity of land donor Gail Freeman.

The 112 acre land donation adds critical habitat to the Nature Trust's Turtle Sanctuary at Barren Meadow near Colpton, northwest of Bridgewater. Nova Scotians have generously stepped up twice before to help the Nature Trust purchase two adjacent properties on Barren Meadow.

Expedition for the Earth: Ecuador 2018 Itinerary Announced

We hope you can join Expedition for the Earth adventure to Ecuador September 22-29, 2018! The expedition is a fundraising trek where all funds raised go directly toward our land conservation efforts in Nova Scotia. Adventurers will explore the upper amazon, cloud forests and Andean peaks of Northern Ecuador.

This bucket-list trip is widely accessible, and previous trekking or international travel experience is not necessary. The trip will be expertly guided by Wally Berg of [Berg Adventures International](#), who has experience guiding countless treks around the world. Berg Adventures International led both of the Nature Trust's previous Expedition for the Earth adventures to Patagonia in 2013 and Iceland in 2016. Together the treks have raised over \$100,000 in support of land conservation in Nova Scotia.

The first three participants have already signed up for the adventure and we would love to reach 5 by the end of 2017!

On Oct. 2, Dalhousie University Faculty of Science students took part in a mini BioBlitz in our backyard, and they recorded their findings on a great online citizen science tool, iNaturalist.org. They documented the species that are found at our house, so that we can measure the increase in biodiversity over the coming years as we undertake plans to naturalize our garden!
